

First Exhibit to Document the History of Little Haiti, Miami, FL.

“Little Haiti, Then and Now” was first exhibited in May and June 2005 in the lobby of the Stephen P. Clark Center, the main government building for Miami-Dade County.

It is based on a soon-to-be-released booklet titled “The Settlement and History of Little Haiti,” which explores the evolution of this ethnic community over the past 40 years, 1965- 2005.

The exhibit features charcoal sketches by Haitian artist Willer Fils-Aimé of the pioneer settlers of Little Haiti (1965-1979) as well as current community leaders.

The exhibit, approximately 40 panels on foam core, consists of text, photographs, sketches, timeline, and glossary of terms. It is available to travel for exhibit at your institution.
